Thinking Like a Historian Means...

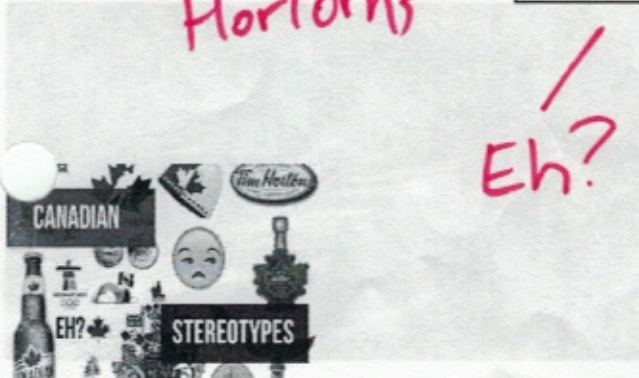
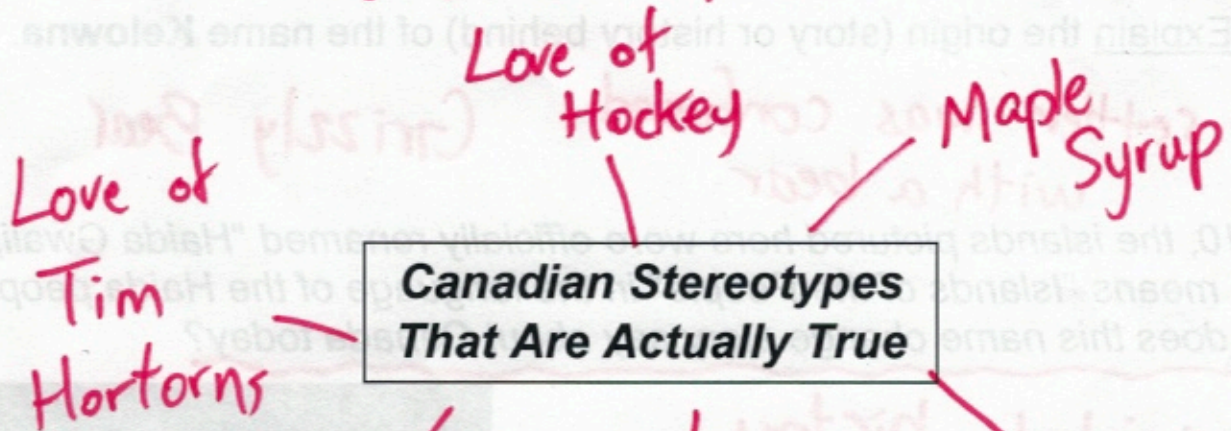
thinking about change over time, things stay the same or change

*Why is Canada Culturally Diverse?*

#### Culture

a people's habits, languages, traditions, beliefs and behaviours

#### Diversity

the inclusion of different types of people (such as people of different races or cultures)

#### Analyzing Perspective



*Perspective is how a person...*

sees and understands people, places, events, issues

*Perspectives are shaped by...*

experiences, opinions, knowledge, values

*Different people...* have different perspectives



People in the past may have...

had different perspectives than today

### 1) Geographical Perspectives
